# Fiscal Updates: FY25 and FY26 Grants

## <u>Important Deadlines</u>

November 30th: Summer FY26 FERs are due. FER can be used to claim any previously unclaimed final expenditures.

# Fiscal Updates: FY25 and FY26 Grants

## Final Financial Reports (FER)

FERs are due 60 days after the grant ends. If FY25 grantees have not completed the FER, please do so ASAP. Please contact Cashay Grant-Woods if you need support in completing the FER.



## <u>Claiming Funds</u>

❖ Please remember to submit requests for reimbursement. Request reimbursements <u>ONLY</u> for the funds used. Please do not submit reimbursements for any funds that are not yet used, and/or grantees do not plan to use.







# Fiscal Updates: Amendments

Amendments are generated by grantees, and Cashay cannot open amendments on the grantee's behalf. Please go to the application, at the top, select APPLICATION REVISION STARTED to begin the process.

Applications do not need to be amended if there is no significant change in the Program's objectives, <u>and</u> less than or equal to \$100 or 10% of the line (whichever is greater), or does not exceed \$10,000.





# Fiscal Updates: GEM\$ Info

- ❖ If applications are returned for edits, please review the comment section to see what is being requested. Please give it your prompt attention. Grantees will not be able to use the funding as desired until it is DESE fiscally approved.
- The contractual service line-item is only for expenses under \$25K. Expenses greater than \$25K should go under the MAJOR contractual service line. Applications will be returned for edits if items are classified incorrectly.









# Fiscal Updates: FC461A and 461B

### School Year FY26 Early College Planning Grant FC461

• Option A (FC461A) is available in GEM\$. All applications must be at the LEA Superintendent step by the deadline of Friday, November 7th.

❖ Option B(FC461B) is available in GEM\$. All applications must be at the LEA Superintendent step by the deadline of Friday, November 21st. Please note, you can begin the application, but you will not be able to submit budgets for review until the funding is loaded. Please allow 1 to 2 weeks for this to be completed.









# Fiscal Updates: ISAs

#### Public IHEs ONLY

- ❖ For programs that require an ISA, you cannot use or allocate funding until the ISA is finalized. The Office of Early College does not manage or disperse ISAs. The Office of Grants Management is solely responsible for this component.
- In GEM\$, if your program's name begins with ISA, you are responsible for ensuring your ISAs are accurate and reflect your current budget.
- This information does not pertain to private Colleges and Universities.


